

DAY	EVENTS
3 April	<p><u>KIEL</u>: 306th as 40th "A" headed 1st Division with 36 A/C including 6 PFF led by Col. Sutton; also 12 A/C including 1 PFF as high squadron of 40 "B". The target was a submarine construction basin in the dock area at Kiel. Poor weather forced the assembly altitude 1,000 feet higher than was briefed, but no further trouble was encountered. Each squadron attacked the target, under 10/10 clouds, on separate PFF runs.</p> <p>Enemy fighter opposition was nil. Meager low scattered bursts of A.A. fire at Kiel caused no damage.</p>
4 April	<p><u>FASSBERG</u>: 306th flew 36 A/C including 4 PFF as 40 "C" led by Lt. Hess. The target was an airfield located at Fassberg. Lead squadron dropped on first run, but the high made two runs before bombing. The low, after following high over target twice, brought bombs back. Pictures show lead and high on an ordnance depot in small town near the briefed target. 8/10 weather conditions prevented good visual sightings.</p> <p>No flak, no fighters.</p>
5 April	<p><u>WEIDEN</u>: 306th flew 36 A/C including 4 PFF as 40 "B" led by Capt. Matzke. 9/10 weather conditions forced the group to bomb by PFF methods on the small town of Weiden.</p> <p>No flak, no fighters.</p> <p>Six 306th A/C bombed with other groups because of difficulty in assembling.</p>
6 April	<p><u>LEIPZIG</u>: 306th flew 38 A/C including 4 PFF and 2 spares as 40 "B" led by Capt. Dorich. The target was the huge railway station in the center of Leipzig. 10/10 cloud coverage caused the group to attack by PFF and plotted scope photos indicate very good results.</p> <p>No R/A opposition. Meager to moderate flak was inaccurate from Leipzig.</p>
7 April	<p><u>WESENDORF</u>: Capt. Hubbell led the 306th as 40th "C" with 36 A/C including 4 PFF. The target was a group of installations on the Wesendorf airfield. Each squadron bombed visually, and pictures show briefed aiming point solidly hit. Results were described as excellent.</p> <p>Meager A.A. fire from various places along the route caused no damage to this group. No enemy fighters.</p>
8 April	<p><u>HALBERSTADT</u>: Major Hulings led the 306th as 40 "A" with 36 A/C including 4 PFF. Because Buckeye reported target #1 to be obscured by 10/10 clouds, the group proceeded to #2 priority, the marshalling yards at Halberstadt. 4-5/10 coverage made it necessary for the lead to start a PFF run. Shortly before bombs away, a visual correction was accomplished. High, with sickie equipment out, dropped off lead. Photos show both squadron patterns in the town. Low, on visual run, hit marshalling yards.</p> <p>No fighters, no flak.</p>
9 April	Mission Scrubbed.
10 April	<p><u>ORANIENBURG</u>: 306th flew 36 A/C including 4 PFF as 40 "B" led by Capt. Murphy. The target was a group of installations on the airfield at Oranienburg, a town north of Berlin. Excellent weather prevailed throughout the trip and allowed each squadron to make a visual run. Lead pattern blanketed briefed aiming point, and high followed suit. Low bombs fell into smoke of lead. Results were described as excellent.</p> <p>No fighter opposition. No A.A. fire was encountered at the target, but the formation was forced into Wittenberge flak by another group heading east. Meager fire was very accurate on the 306th causing the following damage: Lead, none; low, 4 severe, 2 slight, 1 down on continent; high, 3 severe, 2 slight.</p> <p>369th A/C, pilot Lt. Babin, was hit by flak at Wittenberge. The tail compartment was blown off, and the plane was last seen heading west under control. Lt. Babin bailed his crew out east of Hamover, and all returned to Allied hands safely except Sgt. T.J. Rickerl, who was KIA.</p>

11 April.	<p>KRAILBURG: Capt. Matzke led the 306th as 40 "C" with 36 A/C including 4 PFF. A high explosive factory located at Krailburg was the target for the day. All three squadron patterns fell into the assigned target area and results were very good.</p> <p>No flak, no fighters.</p>

13 April	<p>NEUMUNSTER: Major Kesling led the 306th as 40 "A" with 36 A/C including 4 PFF. The #2 priority target, which the group attacked on Buckeye's suggestion, was a marshalling yard at Neumunster. Lead pattern fell into smoke of previous bombing. However high and low bombardiers changed their aiming points to unhit parts of the yards, and photos show strikes from both squadrons on the target.</p> <p>No flak, no fighters.</p>

14 April	<p>ROYAN AREA: Lt. Clays led the 306th with 36 A/C including 4 PFF as 40 "C". The target was a group of gun positions near Royan on the mouth of the Garonne River leading to Bordeaux. Heavy bombers were being used to soften up the area before the invasion by the French. Lead and high patterns hit in the briefed area; however the low bombardier synchronized on the wrong patch of woods and his bombs fell to the north.</p> <p>No flak, no fighters.</p>

One of the most unfortunate accidents in the history of the group occurred today when a 367th aircraft crashed on the Isle of Man on a non-operational flight to Langford Lodge, Ireland. Lt. Vieille, pilot of the ill-fated Fortress, was hampered by very poor visibility in the area and probably was unable to see the hill on the southern tip of the Island where the plane was found. Other members in the A/C, all of whom were in the 367th: Capt. G. E. Cumberly, Squadron Executive, Capt. Butterfield, Squadron Operations, Daily Rea, American Red Cross, Lt. Liersch, pilot, Lt. Parrish, pilot, P/O Le Compte, navigator, Lt/Sgt. Jones, Sgt. Smalczewski, Sgt. Gallion, Sgt. Starouck. There were no survivors.

ROYAN AREA: Maj. McKinney led the 306th as 40 "A" with 39 A/C including 4 P/F and 3 spares. The target, in the same area as the 14th, was a gun emplacement at the mouth of the Gironne River northwest of Bordeaux. Visual conditions persisted but a change in ground winds caused smoke from previous bombing to obscure briefed 306th aiming point. This necessitated lead bombardier to change his sighting to the briefed target #2, another group of guns further down the beach. Lead pattern fell directly on the new selection. Low bombardier likewise changed his aiming point and his bombs hit a small deck area on the south bank. High squadron, because of interference from another group, dropped to south of low.
No flak, no fighters.

16 April	<p>PLATTING: Maj. Kesling led the 306th as 40 "A" at the head of 1st Division with 38 A/C including 4 PFF and 2 spares. The target was a very active marshalling yard at Plattling in southern Germany. With excellent weather conditions prevailing, each squadron attacked visually. Pictures show the target completely covered by bursts from 306th bombs, this mission being one of the most successful in the group's colorful history.</p> <p>No A.A. fire was encountered. No enemy fighters were seen.</p>

17 April	<p><u>DRESDEN</u>: 306th flew 39 A/C including 4 PFF and 3 spares as 40 "C" led by Capt. Hasso. The large marshalling yard in southern Dresden was the target for the day. Dense persistent contrails and haze in the target area caused the lead bombardier, 1st Lt. Oldenburg, much difficulty; however, he managed a visual sighting and pictures show lead bombs on the briefed aiming point. High bombed largely by PFF, and pattern fell to north. Because of poor visibility over Dresden, 5 A/C of the low squadron, unable to see the lead drop, brought bombs back.</p> <p>No E/A. Moderate tracking flak in the target area caused the following damage: low, 1 slight; high, 2 slight, 1 severe.</p>
18 April	<p><u>ROSENHEIM</u>: Maj. Buie led the 306th as 40 "BW" with 39 A/C including 4 PFF and 3 spares. A transformer and switching station on the marshalling yard at Rosenheim was the target. 8-5/10 coverage over the target allowed visual bomb runs by each squadron. 306th bombs completely obscured the briefed aiming point, and at least 2 explosions were reported by crews.</p> <p>Meager inaccurate A.A. fire tracked the group from Hattenberg. Damage: low, 2 severe. No enemy fighters.</p>
19 April	<p><u>FALKENBERG</u>: Maj. Bulings led the 306th with 38 A/C including 4 PFF-Gee-H and 2 PFF as 40 "A". A marshalling yard in the small town of Falkenberg was the target for the day. Lead, on second run, and high bombs fell squarely on aiming point. Low bombardier, finding his sighting affected by previous 306th bombing, changed the aiming point to another section of the town's railway system. Pictures show the selected point well hit by the low after its third run.</p> <p>No enemy fighters. One A/C from the low received severe damage from Torgan during one of the squadron's turns over the target.</p>

28 April	Special operations pertaining to the delivery of leaflet messages to both occupied and liberated areas on the continent were assigned to the 369th Squadron on this day. A briefed mission of this sort was scrubbed.
29 April	<p>369th dispatched 8 A/C on a special leaflet mission to the following objectives: #1 - Mannheim, Weimar; #2 - Chemnitz, Leipzig, Magdeburg; #3 - La Rochelle, La Pallice; #4 - Lorient, St. Nazaire; #5 - d'Oleron; #6 - Dunkirk, The Hague, Dordrecht; #7 - Amsterdam; #8 - Utrecht, Rotterdam. All A/C dropped their nickels and returned to base safely. No observations.</p>
30 April	<p>369th dispatched 7 A/C on special leaflet mission to the following objectives: #1 - La Pallice, La Rochelle; #2 - Lorient, St. Nazaire; #3 - d'Oleron; #4 - Tessel; #5 - The Hague, Dordrecht, Dunkirk; #6 - Utrecht, Rotterdam; #7 - recalled by 1st Air Division because of weather. All other A/C dropped their nickels and returned to base safely.</p>

EVENTS

As the month of April, 1945 came to an end, members of the 306th Bombardment Group wondered just when the German war machine would surrender. Surely the final victory was in sight with thousands of Jerry prisoners being captured daily. Developments in the campaign against the Hun were so tremendous that further resistance of any seriousness was highly doubtful. Among the more impressive news was the link-up of American and Russian forces in the town of Torgau on the Elbe River northeast of Leipzig. This great action split the Reich in two, thereby rendering effective communications between northern and southern German armies practically useless. Further gains were too numerous to mention, and the situation was becoming a ridiculous route.

The month did not pass without its black cloud, however. On the evening of the 12th, base personnel were shocked to hear of the sudden death of President Franklin Roosevelt. No word as to the condition of the Chief Executive had been issued immediately prior to his passing, and therefore most of the station was unprepared for the untimely blow.

During the latter part of April two more world figures made head lines for the last time. Benito Mussolini, former head man in Italy, was assassinated by angry Partisans in Milan. "Il Duce" was attempting to escape advancing armies in Germany. The other gentleman, whose body has yet to be found, was Adolf Hitler. An announcement of his death brought to Grand Admiral Doenitz the position of "Fuehrer" in the Reich.

With the condition of affairs in the land of the Hun becoming more unstable daily, the outlook was extremely bright for the Allies.

The 306th Bombardment Group participated in a total of 15 missions during the month of April. Favorable weather allowed the highest percentage of visual bombing for many months and results in general on these were very satisfactory, ranging from good to excellent on the 11 visual operations. 4 of the missions were on H2X with unobserved results. In addition, 2 special leaflet missions were accomplished. Targets varied for the month, with railway facilities, ordnance dumps, airfields, and dock areas among those attacked. On 2 occasions sorties were flown against German-occupied areas in France. These were tactical missions in support of ground forces attacking the pockets. Due to the rapid advance of Allied ground forces engulfing the Reich, and the subsequent link-up with the Soviet army, many targets were over-ran and no bombing missions were flown by the Group after 19 April.

As in the past months friendly fighter support was excellent, and the Luftwaffe was conspicuous by its absence. There are no claims against the enemy. One bomber was lost due to flak, but with one exception the crew is safe in Allied hands.

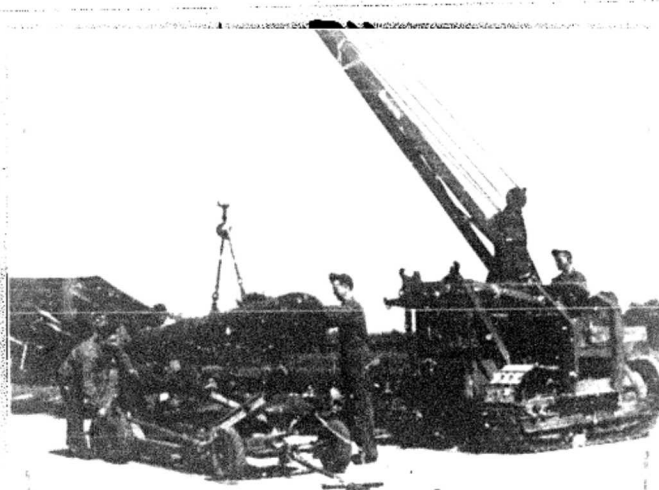
On the statistical side the 306th flew 558 effective sorties, dropped 1539 7/20 HE, x 143 incendiaries, and 265 leaflet bombs for the loss of one plane. These figures compare to the group totals of 9606 effective sorties, 19294 HE, 2064 9/10 incendiaries, for 177 lost.

Colonel James S. Sutton was replaced by Colonel H. H. Upham as Commanding Officer, April 16, 1945. Lieut. Col. F. J. Hardison assumed duties as Deputy Commanding Officer, April 16, 1945.

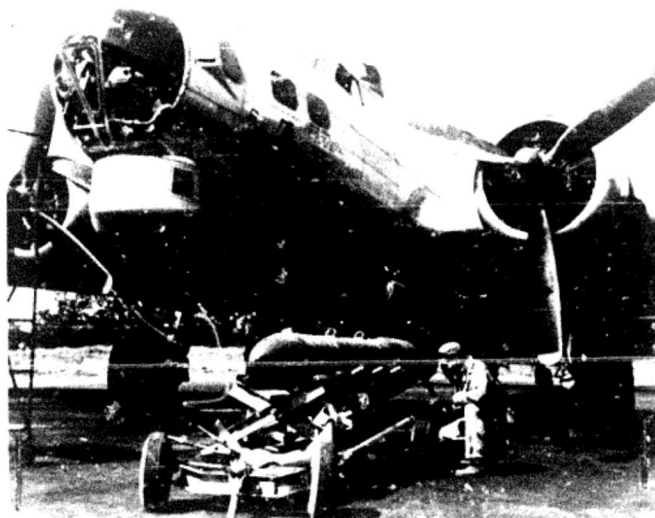

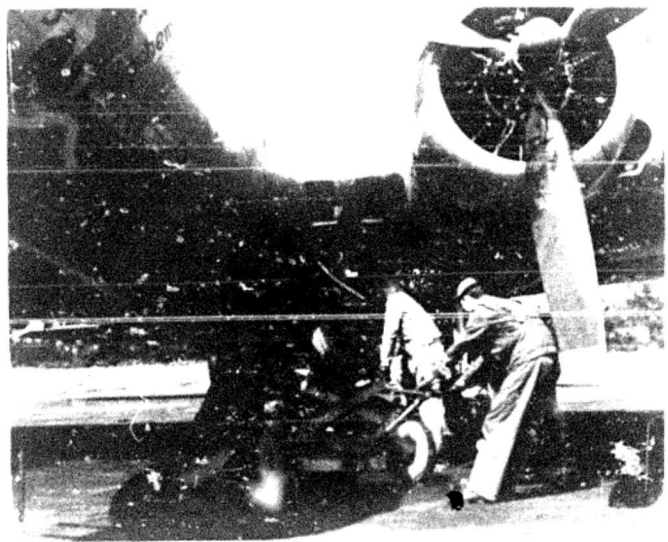

In this capacity, Chrapaty is responsible for the ordering and issuance of such varied items as alarm clocks, cigarettes, toilet articles and candy to every member of this station. The Post Exchange also operates a barber shop, soda fountain and a gift mailing service which enables the men to send selected articles back to the States. The efficient and courteous service which Chrapaty and his staff have given their customers during the long months of the European War has been a strong morale factor on this base.

Now in his thirtieth month overseas with the pioneer Eighth Air Force, Chrapaty entered the Armed Forces in February, 1942.
