This, the last month of 1944, afforded little in the way of known operational successes. Poor weather held the group to twelve missions, two of which were visual. The same contacts also confronted photographic recommissance units with the result that very little of our bombing damage was assessed. However, whenever possible, directif were sent from the field to attach mostly transportation and communication targets vital to the Hun's defensive armies. A majority of the comput men on the field professed a desire to fly more sortles in direct aid to ground forces on the restorn front. 


