| 2nd | <u>St. Cecily, France</u> The 306th put up 28 a/c and 27 a/c bombed this tactical target on PFF through 10/10 cloud with unobserved results. 17 a/c plus one PFF led by Capt. Frazer, 423rd, formed the low Group and 10 a/c plus one PFF led by Capt. Lund, 368th, flew with the high composite 92nd Bomb. Group of the 40th C.B.W. No E/A or A.A. gun fire were seen. |
| | <u>Mass-Palaiseau, France</u> The 306th put up 15 a/c which completed bombing with good results. 12 a/c led by Lt. Raster of the 367th formed the low Group and 3 a/c led by Lt. Saunders of the 369th led the low Squadron of the high composite Group of the 40th C.B.W. The low Group, first over the target, bombed the railway bridge and marshalling yards with excellent results. The high composite Group bombed the last resort, believed to be Conches A/D, and large fires were seen after bombing. Some accurate flak was met at Cormeilles, North of Paris. Excellent fighter support was provided, no E/A were seen. |
| 3rd | <u>St. Cecily, France</u> The 306th put up 17 a/c, led by Capt. Frazer, Jr., 423rd, for a repeat performance on French coast heavy gun emplacements. Bombing was on PFF through 10/10 cloud. No A.A. gun fire or E/A were encountered. |
| 4th | <u>Euville, France</u> The 306th put up 12 a/c led by Capt. McMahon of the 368th. 11 a/c bombed this coast gun emplacement with good results. No E/A or flak were encountered. All of our a/c returned to base. |
| 6th | <u>D-Day, 1st Mission, Arromanches, France</u> From this day forward the Second Front is a reality. Today we operated in direct support of ground troops. 24 a/c were assigned a 105mm Howitzer installation about one mile inland and 18 a/c attacked a defended locality at Anselles. Takeoff was at 0430 hours. Targets were reached without incident. Due to heavy undercast bombing was by navigational equipment with unobserved results. |
| | <u>D-Day, 2nd Mission: Caen, France</u> The 306th put up 12 a/c led by Capt. Kesling, 423rd, to bomb a road junction in Caen. Takeoff was at 0730 hours - a solid undercast was encountered over the target area and due to absence of PFF equipment all of our a/c returned to base with their bombs. No E/A or flak was seen en route. |

| 6th (cont'd) | D-Day, 3rd Mission: Thury-Harcourt, France 11 a/c plus one PFF flew high Group of 300th "B" CBW and 22 a/c plus 2 PFF flew lead and low groups of the 300th "B" CBW to bomb a bridge over the River Orne. Takeoff was at 1730 hours. Due to most adverse weather conditions there was trouble in assembly with a/c from our group joining other groups and vice-versa. A large cloud over the target made it necessary to use PFF equipment. All a/c, with the exception of one, which aborted, dropped bombs in the target area. No flak or enemy fighters were seen. Crews reported seeing great fires on land and the Channel to be filled with ships and burning craft. |
| 8th | Rennes/St Jacques A/D The 300th put up 36 a/c as lead and low Groups of 18 a/c each in the 40th "A" CBW. Major Salada of the 300th acted as air commander. The lead Group was unable to bomb because of cloud cover and brought bombs back since clouds prevented bombing secondary targets. The low Group dropped its bombs on primary with only fair results. Heager inaccurate flak was encountered at the target. No E/A were seen. |
| 10th | Officers of "A" Mess and invited guests plus "wolves" enjoyed their monthly dance. Beer was the only refreshment served over the bar and the party broke up at a reasonable hour. |
| 11th | Illiers L'Eveque, France The 300th flew 36 a/c as the 40th "B" CBW, led by Lt. Col. R. C. Williams, 367th; and 12 a/c as high Group of the 40th "C" CBW. 10/10 cloud cover with tops up to 20,000 feet were encountered. No bombs were dropped because of other formations below in the cloud and because PFF equipment was out of order. All of our a/c returned to base with their bombs, having encountered neither/nor enemy aircraft. flak |
| 12th | Lille/Vendeville A/D, France. The 300th sent 36 a/c as the 40th "B" CBW led by Major Chalfant, 423rd; and 12 a/c as lead Group of the 40th "C" CBW led by Major Husband, Group Operations Officer. The primary was effectively bombed with a good pattern. Moderate A.A. fire was encountered at the target. On the way home some formations, off course because of 10/10 cloud and strong wind, got some damaging flak from Antwerp. All of our a/c landed safely at base, no E/A having been seen. |

| 14th | <u>Bretigny and Etampes A/B, France</u> The 306th sent 36 a/c led by Major Salada, 306th, as the 40th "A" CBW, and 18 a/c led by Major Flanagan, 309th, as the lead and high Squadrons of the composite Group of the 40th "D" CBW. Weather varied from 2/10 to 10/10 on the way in. Bombing was visual with strike photographs showing good concentrations on the IPI. Moderate accurate tracking gun fire was encountered in the target area. No enemy fighters were seen, our fighters giving continuous cover. All a/c returned to base safely. |
| 15th | <u>Nantes, France</u> The 306th sent 54 a/c to destroy railway bridges across the river at Nantes. 36 a/c formed the 40th "A" CBW led by Lt. Col. McDonald of the 40th Combat Wing. 12 a/c formed the low Group and 6 a/c flew with the high composite Group of the 40th "D" CBW. Strike photographs show hits on railway viaducts and on the northern end of the bridge. The lead and low Groups of the 40th "A" CBW straddled the bridge while high Group hit the aiming point. Moderate accurate tracking flak was encountered at the target knocking out 1st Lt. W. B. O'Brien of the 423rd who was last seen on deck with an engine smoking, but with the a/c under control. Three chutes were seen from this a/c. No E/A were seen and area support was furnished by P-51s. |
| 17th | <u>Noyen, France</u> Todays mission was a hurry-up job due to a change at the last minute. Because of bad weather conditions the assembly was never completed and 7 a/c not being able to find the Group returned to base. Several of our a/c bombed with other formations. The 306th was supposed to fly 34 a/c in lead and low Groups plus 6 a/c in high composite Group of the 40th "B" CBW. Lt. Col. Williams of the 367th led. The assigned primary was covered by a solid undercast. The PFF equipment was out and a bridge at Noyen was chosen as a target of opportunity and bombed through a break in the clouds with unobserved results. Moderate accurate tracking flak was encountered at the French coast going in, knocking out Lt. Dingman of the 367th, who was last seen with his right wing on fire, but under control; five chutes were seen from his a/c. Lt. J.W. Pedersen also of the 367th was hit at the same time and feathered an engine, but continued on with the formation to bomb the target. On the way out near Le Mans one of his engines caught fire and the a/c disappeared in the clouds spinning. Nine chutes were observed from this a/c. No E/A were seen, P-51s giving close support throughout the mission. |

| 18th | <u>Hamburg, Germany</u> Todays target was an oil refinery and storage depot. 306th flew 18 a/c as high Group of the 40th "A" CBW and 18 a/c as high Group of the 40th "B" CBW. Haze, 5/10 cloud, and a smoke screen were encountered at the primary. The 40th "A" bombed on PFF but the 40th "B" was unable to drop its bombs because of a malfunction of equipment and brought back their bombs. Flak was intense, but less than that usually met at this target. No E/A were seen and P-51s and P-38s gave close support at all times. |
| 19th | <u>Noball target, France</u> The 306th put up 54 a/c to form the 40th "C" CBW led by Major Chalfant of the 423rd, to bomb the "pilotless plane launching platforms". Due to 10/10 undercast all bombs were returned except two a/c loaded with "booby traps" which were jettisoned in the Channel. Meager A.A. gun fire was encountered at the French coast going in. No E/A were seen. |
| 20th | <u>Hamburg, Germany</u> The target was again oil plants. The 306th flew 52 a/c as the complete 40th "A" CBW with Major Chalfant, 423rd leading. Visual bombing was very effective; the high and low group hitting the aiming point and black clouds of smoke rose to 10,000 feet with many fires. The lead Group hit the marshalling yards east of their MPI. Lead and high Groups encountered intense accurate flak, knocking out Lt. Latham, 423rd, who went down in flames over the target. Up to 4 chutes were reported out of this a/c. No E/A were definitely identified, and our support was continuous. |
| 21st | <u>Berlin, Germany</u> Our first big attack on the industrial center of this city since the invasion of Normandy. The 306th put up 53 a/c as a composite 40th "A" CBW led by Major Salada, 368th. Assembly was good and the northern route was taken to the target. The bombing run was started for visual bombing, but dense contrails caused much confusion over the target and made instrument flying necessary. Strike photographs locate some hits near the Tempelhof A/D. Just before the target Lt. Tell, 367th, was straggling with two bad engines and was attacked by two FW 190's and the top turret gunner destroyed one of these. After this attack Lt. Tell's left wing caught on fire but went out in a few minutes, he landed safely at base with one flat tire. A.A. gun fire over the target was an intense barrage and tracking type, damaging 26 of our a/c. P-51s were seen over the coast going in and P-38s furnished support for stragglers coming out. Our score for the day was 1-0-0. |

| 22nd | <u>Ghent, Belgium</u> The 306th furnished 50 a/c to form the 40th "A" CBW led by Major Flannagan, 369th, and the low group of the 40th "B" CBW. On this beautiful summer afternoon our bombers took off at 1600 hours. Trip to the target was flown as briefed and only meager flak was met at the enemy coast, damaging three of our a/c. Bombing was excellent with good patterns squarely on the MPI. No E/A were seen and all of our planes landed safely at base. |
| 24th | <u>Bremen, Germany</u> The 306th flew 40 a/c as lead and low Groups of the 40th "B" CBW led by Lt. Col. Williams, 367th. Six of these a/c were assigned the high squadron of high composite Group of the 40th "A" CBW. Bombing was PPF through 10/10 undercast. PPI show that the Weser Flugzeugbau suffered severe damage with hits on 12 of its 14 buildings. Moderate low barrage flak at target accounted for minor battle damage. No E/A were seen and support was excellent. "B" Mess celebrated with a party and no apparent casualties resulted. |
| 25th | <u>Joinville, France</u> Another tactical target assigned; a railway bridge at Cheny. The 306th flew the complete 40th "A" CBW, plus 12 a/c in the high group of the 40th "C" CBW. Strike photos show the MPI completely blanketed by bombs of all Groups. Lt. Esper, bombardier, 369th, received slight leg injuries from flak at Romilly, where meager A.A. fire was met. There was no E/A opposition and escort was good. |
| 26th | <u>Laon/Athies a/w, France</u> The 306th furnished 36 a/c to form the 40th "A" CBW led by Major Flannagan, 369th. On the first run the lead did not drop its bombs due to rack malfunction; however, the low and high Groups dropped with good results. The lead came around for another run, saw other CBWs going in and as the MPI seemed to be well hit, proceeded to bomb the secondary target, an A/D at Denain, with good results. Flak was encountered in three places, damaging all a/c of the lead Group. No E/A were seen, support was excellent, and all of our a/c returned to base. |

| | <p><u>Narrative</u></p> <p>The 306th Bombardment Group (H) again posted the previous high record in every department during the month of June. With the advent of cross Channel operations, sorties were flown on an ever increasing scale. A greater tonnage was dropped in this month than in the first 8 months the Group operated in this theater. Despite the high tonnage and number of sorties, losses were among the lowest yet recorded over a thirty day period. Primarily, operations were against tactical targets in the occupied countries, supporting the ground offensive. PFF technique was employed on 7 missions, visual bombing on 11 and bombs were returned 3 times. Visual bombing was very good for the month, with strikes on Hamburg oil plants proving to have been one of the best missions ever performed by the group.</p> <p>Enemy opposition was very weak from the Luftwaffe and friendly support was very good. No planes were lost to E/A during the month, the 5 losses being accounted to flak. One enemy fighter was destroyed during the month.</p> <p>D-day saw the cancellation of the 30 mission tour of combat and after some delay this was lengthened to 35 missions now required by new combat men.</p> <p>Nine men are now used on a crew and some gunners are now finishing their tour of operations without having fired a shot at one E/A.</p> |
