HE SHOWED US (DON & I) HIS SURGERY - WAS CUT FROM HIS UPPER CHEST TO HIS GROIN. HIS DOCTOR TOLD HIM THAT IT WAS COLEN CANCER AND THAT IT WAS TERMINAL. HE SAID THAT HE WAS GOING TO MAKE THE REUNION IN ENGLAND REGARDLESS. I CONVERSED WITH HIM QUITE OFTE IN LONDON. DON'T KNOW HOW HE MANAGED IT. - "BUT HE DID GO". ED. WAS IN THE 423RD SQDN. I WAS IN THE 367TH P.O.W. OCT, 14, 42 SCHWEINFURT. HE GOT TO ENGLAND IN 1944. WELL RUSS. TAKE IT EASY; IF POSSIBLE. HOPE TO SEE YOU ALL IN SEATTLE NEXT YEAR.

Edward W. Beaver, III, 68, of Westbrook Dr., passed away Friday, November 13, 1992, at home.

He was born in North Adams, MA, March 1, 1924, the son of Edward W. and Lillian Jackson Beaver, II. Edward was a graduate of Hartwick College. He was an Air Force Veteran of WW II with three years of service as a technical sergeant in radio operations and gunnery, having flown on 28 missions. Edward was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, four air medals, European Theatre Combat Award, Air Over Germany Award and the American Theatre Award. In 1949, he married Carolina Bauer.
