Thank you for asking me to real the stories you and Dan Barberis wrote about ditaking in the North Dea, 21 May 1943.

To the best of my recollection the stories seem accurate with only two exceptions.

at the beginning of the story about medals won it states the raid was to Bremen. It should read to Wilhelmshoven.

another paragraph states that clarence W. Lurham did not appear on any of the orders for midals. I believe you have in your possession a capy of General Order #74, 12 June 1943. How will find in Section II at bottom of page 15 that Clarence U. Lurham was awarded the & F.C. The citation mentions the mission of 21 May 1943 and the forces landing of our cirplane in the sea. Having previously been awarded the air medal with three oak less clusters, det. Durham was given the DFC a couple of months after the ditching Stot. Zygmund Clarminski svas severely injured (shot in right elbow) while flying as a waist gunner on Frank M. Kockstetter's crew. After months of hospital care Warminski was returned to

the States I completed my twenty-five missions on 2 Oct. 1943. Ofter Serving three months as a turret instructor with another Group I returned to the States on the same troop-ship with Warminski_ I like the pictures you intend to use, and have identified the crow members in the dingly-In the photograph of Cal. Curtis Le May congratulating It. Charith and crew I am pictured second from the left and am mistakinly identified as Clarina F. Buchanan instead of Gennett F. Buchanan. I feel that we were extremely fortunate to be accidentally picked up by a British mine sweeper 200 miles from England, for I believe that in May 1943 the Air-Sea Rescue of perated only in the English Channel and the Deep - dea Rescue Mervice was not yet in operation-On behalf of myself and all the crew I send my heartfelt thanks to you and Lon for writing these stories.
