I am wading through an accumulation of material on my desk, and have in front of me the two "nose art" photos you sent me.

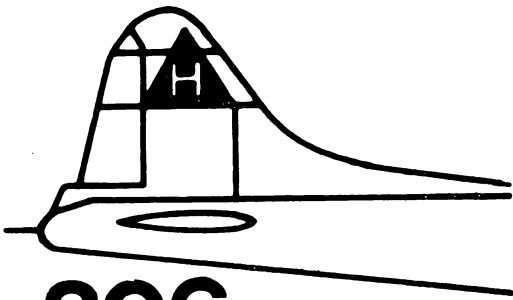
Now, the puzzle I have is what were the plane numbers for these two aircraft? Anything will help, either the entire number, or the last three numbers.
