Warren and I flew during much the same period. I arrived at Thurleigh about three weeks before and was assigned to the 367th squadron as a navigator, and I completed my combat tour late in November.

Thus, we undoubtedly flew on many of the same missions. I just never got to Brussels.

I just received a letter from Shirley Doman telling me that Warren passed away on Dece 17th of last year.

I had some correspondence with him shortly before that.

She tells me that he only lasted about 5 weeks from the time they decided what was wrong with him.

We were in the same Quonset Hut and Warren was a lot of fun. A real good " Song and Dance Man" with a real good dry sense of humor.

It's funny that although we actually spent only a short time together, we got to know each other so well and it's so easy to remember things that happened then.

I think that Warren and Gerry Carrazzone went to college together later on after the War.

Warren had a couple of real tough experiences in the Fall of 1944 and only got a broken ankle out of it.

His address is listed in the 306th Directory and Shirley Doman tells me she plans to stay on at that address in case you want to drop her a note.
