Mr Strong, All my pictures and the list of missions flown were taken from my possession about  
over

one week before I left the 306th. I do  
remember that I did not participate in  
the <sup>disruptive</sup> Schuierfurt raid; however.

The only leads that I knew  
were in the 306th was a young man  
named Billy Adams from Whiteville, Va. <sup>my home town</sup>  
I believe Tail Gunner, killed in action  
before I joined 306. Another ground mechanic  
named Alfred Rodriguez from Whiteville Va  
died of a massive heart attack 5-8 years  
after the war was over. <sup>WIFE ALSO DECEASED</sup> An ex navigator  
named Vernado (lost name) was either  
a graduate student or professor at FSU,  
rather more known than here. I think he was  
in 306th.

I will not be able to make the convention  
in Iowa but I am looking forward to  
the one in 1995. Thanks for the phone call & material

I believe the chief cook in one of

named Wolfe a member of the Wolfe
