MISSOULA — Marvin H. Goss, 66, of Missoula, died of complications following surgery Tuesday, Jan. 16, at St. Patrick Hospital.

He was born Jan. 14, 1924, to Willard and Emma Goss in Yakima, Wash., where he was raised and educated.

During World War II, Mr. Goss served in Europe, where he met Sheila Summers and married her. They later divorced. On Sept. 26, 1980, he married Blanche P. Hickman.

He was preceded in death by his father, a grandchild and great-grandchild.
