Dear Jack:

It was nice of you to call, and I happy to help you in your efforts to give the Hop family more information about Yuen.

I have included the orders under which he came to the 306th; the Mission Intelligence narrative, track chart, and formation chart; a couple of pages from my book, First Over Germany, which is the history of the 306th, and gives more graphic detail about the experience of Hop's plane. I think, most of this came from Gen. Woellner and Glenn Korf; and a list of addresses of men on his last mission and the original members of his crew we have on our mailing list.

Lastly, I have included one of my biographical forms and a reply envelope. I hope they will fill out a few details about Yuen and return the sheet to me. I filled in some of the service data they might not otherwise have.

He did receive the Air Medal and one oak leaf cluster that I have been able to find, both issued in December.

You might also give them the copy of 306th Echoes, which they may find interesting, and it also tells how to order copies of my book and also the Squadron Diaries. There is one paragraph on Yuen's plane in the Squadron Diary.

Glad I could be of help.
