The new directory has been received and think from an informative perspective it is well done.

I don't know if I have informed Russell Strong that I became a part of the group Aug. 1942 when I was flown (1st Class Com.) from Siegen field Wash. to Wendover to replace Chester May (1st Lt) who took ill just before the group departed for Europe. He was the group bombardier and they thought I was to assume that position.

Having just finished training at Victorville, Ca. I was assigned to Liberator and

2/ only had a couple of practice runs. No gunnery etc. in heavy aircraft. I'd never even seen a B17.

I'm telling you this because May is listed as the bombardier on Capt. Younce's crew (423rd) and I think the record should be corrected. I joined Younce Hopkins Baslin in Aug. 1942 as replacement for Lt. May and ^{with them} flew to Gander + Brewster to complete the crew.

Just thought the records should be corrected.

I might add that after finishing my tour and return to the U.S. I was sent back to France after a yr. state ride to fly 50 missions in B26's as a pathfinder for groups in 9th Air Force.
