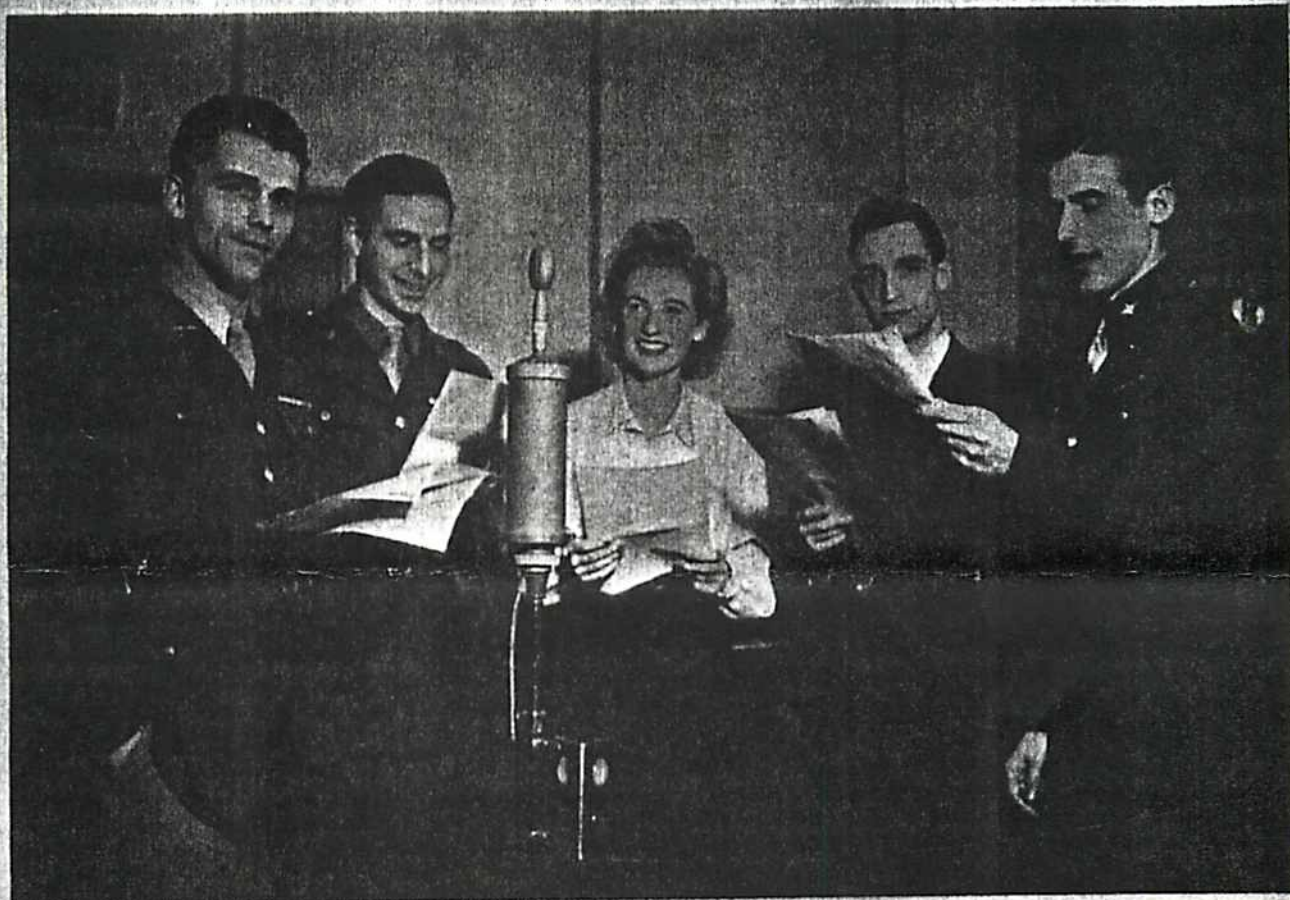

# L'HEURE UNIVERSITAIRE

Comme, on le sait, Radio-Genève donne chaque mois à ses auditeurs un reflet de la vie universitaire. Celle-ci suscite en Suisse, et surtout à l'étranger, il faut bien l'avouer, un grand intérêt. Le courrier qui parvient au studio de France, de Belgique, voire d'Espagne, en témoigne. Il n'est pas douteux que le goût des hautes études demeure toujours vivant dans nos pays voisins et amis et qu'en dépit de la guerre — et peut-être précisément en raison des ravages matériels que celle-ci a causés — ces pays tiennent plus que jamais à assigner aux valeurs spirituelles la juste place que celles-ci doivent occuper dans la hiérarchie humaine. Toujours est-il que l'«Heure universitaire» permet, en outre, de mieux prendre contact avec les universités étrangères. On l'a constaté encore l'autre jour, alors qu'un groupe de soldats américains séjournant à Genève, où ils suivent des cours à l'Université, ont participé, pour le plus grand plaisir des sans-filistes, à l'émission du lundi 25 février. Emission pittoresque, d'ailleurs, car elle fut bilingue. En effet, le major Staman et le sergent Epstein parlèrent en français de leur séjour en Suisse, de leurs études et révélèrent — détail piquant — qu'un étudiant américain donnait, en français, un cours sur les constitutions des Etats-Unis. Pour sa part, le lieutenant Jenkins faisait entendre, en anglais, «la voix de l'Amérique». Il le fit avec aisance, car n'est-il pas un authentique collaborateur de la radio américaine? Par ailleurs, un petit groupe de soldats-étudiants, dirigés pour la circonstance par Hugues Cuénod, permit d'apprécier la valeur de plusieurs chants caractéristiques, dont notamment un negro spiritual très savoureux.

Ces sympathiques étudiants quitteront Genève vers la fin mars en y laissant le meilleur souvenir. Annonçons dès aujourd'hui que la prochaine émission de l'Heure universitaire sera consacrée à la Faculté des lettres. Mais pour compléter l'exposé fait récemment par le professeur Chodat sur la pénicilline, un reportage sera réalisé au laboratoire de microbiologie. Les auditeurs du Studio de Genève pourront juger à cette occasion que l'étude théorique n'est pas cantonnée dans une sphère inaccessible. En effet, les recherches de ce laboratoire sont directement utilisées par les grandes industries du pays.
