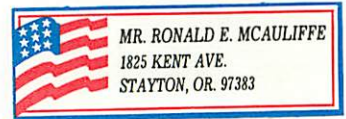

the correct spelling is: NIEMYSKI.

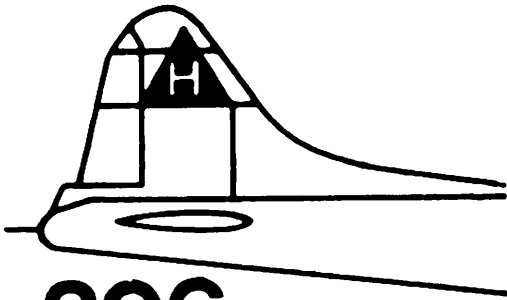
