— Talmage Gordon McDonough, 79, passed away August 16, 2001 at his home of



complications from diabetes. Talmage was born July 29, 1922 to Gordon Talmage and Anne Elizabeth McDonough in Los Angeles, California. He married his sweetheart Yvonne Smith McDonough on January 3, 1945 in Hobbs, New Mexico.

Talmage was raised and educated in Cedar City. At age 17 he joined the Army National Guard attending officers training and flight instruction in Santa Anna, California. After Japan's attack on Pearl Harbor he joined the Air Force becoming an instructor of B-17's in Hobbs, New Mexico. He was assigned to the 367th Bombardment Squadron called the Clay Pigeon's who were the first over Germany along with three other squadrons that made up the 306th bomb group. He flew 34 bombing mission over Germany and obtained the rank of Captain. During his tour he met the King and Queen of England, Princess Elizabeth christened his B-17 the "Rose of York" with General Doolittle in attendance. He received the Distinguished Flying Cross, American Defense Ribbon, Air Medal with three Oak Leaf clusters, EAME Theater Ribbon with Four Bronze Service Stars and the American Theater
