Dear Russ:

Enclosed is a check for the new edition of "First

over Germany".

Also I talked with Henry H. Farmer, 4257 Chanwil Avenue, Memphis, TN 38117, at our Stalag Luft III reunion at Norfolk, VA two weeks ago. He did not know of the 306th reunions or about the book.

Eight of us left Bovington and rode in a covered truck to Thurleigh as replacement officers. Opdyke, Olsen, Couch, Sorden, Farmer, Bernstein and I can't remember the two pilots. This was October 6, although the records show October 5, 1943. I was shot down over Bremen Oct. 8 and captured two days later two miles from Holland. Opdyke, Olsen and Couch went down April 11,1944. Farmer was taken prisoner on Oct. 14 at Schweinfurt and Bernstein died that night from injuries from not having his parachute adjusted properly.

Send Henry a copy of the Echoes and I'm sure he will buy a book and might even show up at San Antonio. At least he is a name to add to "New additions".


