Under that system, the Bond Office would not send the Bonds home until they received a copy of the Pay Roll as definite evidence that the money had been deducted from your pay. Now that is where the time element comes into the story. It seems that the pay roll had to go through many different hands before the Bond Office got it; consequently it seemed to you that your Bond had been overlooked. So starting in April '43 the Bond deal was converted into an Allotment basis which means that all the Bond Office needs now is a notification of the fact that you have a Bond Allotment. And to speed up the delivery of the Bonds purchased before April '43, the names of the men whose folks have not received any Bonds under the old system are being sent to the Bond Office and steps are being taken to see that they are delivered immediately.
