SUGGESTION: "Now that the war with Japan is over, the prospects of a greater number of soldiers getting home this year are brighter. However, those of us who have served faithfully here on this station for the past thirty-five months and longer and who have already been penalized and discriminated against and said to be "non-deserving" for 'Battle Participation Stars' by the War Department, face a sure thing of having to spend a fourth Christmas overseas. Every Enlisted Man and Officer who I have talked with on this point system, both those with and without the stars, all agreed that the awarding of the stars was unfair. Still no adjustment has been made after a period of three months. Our morale doesn't improve when we see those that we have worked with side by side and because of the fact they get 70 points for stars get to return home when some of them have only been overseas for two years. At least an effort could be made to give some consideration for our service by returning us to the Zone of Interior by Christmas. Our loved ones at home can't understand these conditions. We are beginning to think that perhaps we no longer love them or care to get back. How about giving us some information regarding our chances of getting home for Christmas (this year) so we can pass on to those who are anxiously awaiting our return?"
