INFORMATION:

1. All film, except Kodachrome, Kodacolor and movies, now being received by the Photographic Division of Army Exchange Service, is completely processed, censored and placed in the return mail within fortyeight (48) hours after receipt. The processing time for Kodachrome, Kodacolor and movies is longer, depending upon the facilities and location of the particular film manufacturer. Although these films must be sent to this division, the actual processing is done by the various film manufacturers by special arrangements previously made. 35mm Kodachrome is processed in London but because of non-availability of labor and materials they cannot be mounted in individual slides. Kodachrome in sheet or cut film form must be sent to the United States for processing. After processing it can either be returned to the sender or forwarded by the manufacturer to any designated address in the United States. This also applies to Kodacolor film. Movie film, either black and white or color, manufactured by Kodak, is processed in London. All others, including Univex, is forwarded by this division to the United States where it is processed and returned to the sender or forwarded to any point in the United States as requested.

This division has recently obtained a limited supply of 35 mm black and white film. It is of two types, Eastman Super XX and Eastman Panatomic X and we are now in a position to reload 35 mm cassettes. The cost of reloading with either type of film is (2/-) two shillings for eighteen (18) exposures and three shillings twopence (3/2) for thirtysix (36) exposures. To order this film it will be necessary to state under heading of "Miscellaneous Instructions" on the AES Form No. 165, "Reload (number) cassette(s)", type of film "Super XX or Panatomic X", "Number of exposures, eighteen (18) or thirty six (36) inches. Price will be shown in the pricing column.

All amateur photographers are invited to utilize the services of our newly instituted Technical Information Department which will promptly answer all inquiries of a photographic nature. This invitation includes personal visits as well as correspondence.
