SUGGESTION: "I suggest that a railing be placed in front of the counter in the P.M. and that purchasers queue up, as they enter the P.M. Under the present system we are not served in proper order and often those who come in last are served first and those who come in first are served last."

REMARK: Opinion on the value of a railing versus the drawbacks seems to vary. This is the 1st suggestion of this nature, so unless more are received, it would seem inadvisable to make a change.

SUGGESTION: "Can you give us a ruling concerning saluting from bicycles? I note that some salute Officers riding cycles, others do not, and that the Officers themselves may or may not salute a superior from a cycle."

REMARK: You are referred to Sec I, pp 74 (3), P.M. 21-0 for information on this subject. You are not required to salute when, "carrying articles with both hands, or when otherwise so occupied as to make saluting impracticable". Station policy does not require a person riding a bicycle to either render a salute or to return one. If you are a good enough cyclist you are urged to salute - otherwise, just give a verbal greeting. Some people can ride without any hands on the bike - Can You?
