1. The following T&X received from 1st Air Division is quoted for information of all concerned:

"LAD Y-734-A REGARDING CELEBRATION OF AIR FORCE DAY 1 AUG 45 THE POL TT FROM HQ VIII PTR COMD IS QUOTED FOR YOUR INFO AND GUIDANCE: 'YOUR DEPT HAS DESIGNATED AUG 1 AS AIR FORCE DAY, MARKING 38TH ANNIVERSARY OF FOUNDING OF AERONAUTICAL DIV OF THE OFFICE OF CHIEF SIGNAL OFFICES FROM WHICH 1ST AIR FORCE HAS GROWN. IT IS FELT THAT OBSERVANCE THIS YEAR SHOULD BE MORE WIDESPREAD AND SIGNIFICANT THAN NEVER BEFORE. THESE OF AIR FORCE DAY WILL REMEMBER THE WAR IN PACIFIC, ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN EUROPE AND IMPORTANCE OF AIR FORCE, PRESENT AND FUTURE. IT IS DESIRED THAT OBSERVANCE BE SIMPLE, DISTINGUISHED AND ESCORAL AS IS POSSIBLE WITHOUT INTERFERENCE WITH ACTIVITIES. IT IS SUGGESTED THAT YOU ORGANIZE AND UTILIZE THE FULL RESOURCES OF YOUR COMMAND IN A COHERENT EFFORT TOWARD THIS GOAL, BECAUSE OF GREAT DOCUMENTARY VALUE AND AID FOR PLANNING FUTURE AIR FORCE DAYS, REQUEST YOU FORWARD THIS COMMAND FINAL PLANS IN ADVANCE OF AUG 1. A SCRAPBOOK COVERING THE PROGRAM, AND AS SOON AFTER THE ACTIVITY AS POSSIBLE, IS TO BE FORWARDED TO THIS HEADQUARTERS.' ----- LARSON-----"
