INFORMATION:

1. The following teletype is quoted for your information:
1 AD 14-763-D. PURSUANT TO VERBAL AUTHORITY FROM HIGHER HEADQUARTERS THE FOLLOWING MODIFICATIONS OF CENSORSHIP REGULATIONS MAY NOW BE MADE:
 1. IDENTIFY THE CITY OR TOWN IN WHICH STATIONED.
 2. TELL OF PAST TRAVELS IN THE ETO.
 3. BLUE ENVELOPES INCREASED TO SIX (6) PER MONTH.
 4. TELL ABOUT TRIP FROM AMERICA TO EUROPE IF SIX MONTHS OR MORE ELAPSED SINCE ARRIVAL. IDENTIFY THE POE, TIME IN HOURS AND BRIEF ACTION WHICH OCCURRED, IF SIX MONTHS OR MORE HAVE ELAPSED SINCE ARRIVAL.
 5. MEN WHO HAVE BEEN TOLD THEY WILL BE SENT BACK TO THE STATES MAY WRITE HOME AND SAY SO, AND SOLDIERS GOING TO LIBERATED COUNTRIES MAY WRITE HOME ABOUT IT; BUT IF TO AN ACTIVE THEATER, NO INFORMATION MAY BE GIVEN.
 6. CASUALTIES MAY BE MENTIONED BY THE INDIVIDUAL INVOLVED IF FIVE (5) DAYS HAVE PASSED SINCE HE WAS INJURED. HOWEVER, CASUALTIES IN OTHER CASES MAY NOT BE MENTIONED UNTIL THIRTY (30) DAYS HAVE EXPPIRED, OR SOONER IF THE NEXT OF KIN HAS BEEN NOTIFIED PREVIOUSLY.
 7. CITATIONS AND TRAVEL ORDERS WHICH A MAN WENT AS SOUVENIRS MAY BE SENT HOME IF FIRST DECLASSIFIED BY THE ISSUING HEADQUARTERS.
 8. LETTERS RECEIVED BY A SOLDIER ARE ALSO CONSIDERED AS SOUVENIRS AND AS SUCH MAY BE SENT HOME.
 9. DIARIES WHICH CONTAIN NO INFORMATION ABOUT CLASSIFIED MATERIAL AND WHICH DO NOT OTHERWISE VIOLATE CENSORSHIP REGULATIONS MAY BE SENT HOME.

4. TRAVEL RESTRICTION:

The following T.M. is quoted for your information: "L.D. 1-747-G - Following T.M. 8th AF forwarded for information and compliance: D67063 passes involving travel by rail for a distance in excess of 20 miles will not be granted between 16 May and 22 May inclusive. Leaves and furloughs involving travel by rail for a distance in excess of 20 miles will not be granted between 18 May and 22 May inclusive. EXCEPTIONS: (1) Continental leave personnel coming to UK on 7 day leave, (2) Air Combat personnel and (3) Personnel on leave or furlough for the express purpose of attending university course offered by Information and Education Section of this headquarters. CO of personnel indicated above will indorse and initial leave and furlough paper of such personnel in red ink to read 'Authorized to travel by rail'. T.M. 111"

Answer: As you know a world food shortage exists, which has necessitated a cut in the Army Field Ration of 10%. Items in very short supply are meat, lard, sugar and canned fruit.
