SUGGESTION BOX:

SUGGESTION: "If higher Hqs gave the orders on how the 40 I.I. were selected for transfer to the Z of I, they should be advised of the result of their unfair method...about 2/3 of the men selected are undeserving of this privilege which should be reserved for those whose military service and conduct reflect credit on the service.

The majority of these men have been poor soldiers, (one for instance M.M.O.L. from 103 twice in 1942) who due to large amount of time off were able to get women pregnant and who were stupid enough at the time to marry them however their 12 points for children (doubtful if theirs) enable to outpoint good soldiers...If you doubt this check the marriage records... Did higher Hqs also order that in case of tie in points the man with wife and kid in the States (3 years away from them) have to gamble for a chance to go home with those who live with their wives and children in England.

I am a G.I. with a good record (but not enough points to compete with above soldiers) who would like to get home to my American wife and raise some legitimate children (not for the 12 points), who would be an asset to our Nation."

REPLY: This soldiers' gripe is probably legitimate. However, to successfully carry out the return to Z of I program it must be done in an impartial manner exactly as directed by the War Department. Selections cannot be based on race, color, creed, or type of wives and children. The number of points is apparently the criterion in determining a man's worthiness for return to Z of I, not a good record and good intentions.
