Mission: Dulmen, Germany

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H)

1. Narrative

The 306th Group flew 39 A/C including 4 Micro-H, PFF A/C and three spares, as 40th "C", leading the Able Force. Route: Felixstowe 1207; Dutch coast 5140N x 0340E, 1235 hours. Received Buckeye Red's message, 1247, saying weather at target was 10/10, tops 27,000 feet, and that Buckeye was returning to I.P. to see how fast weather was clearing. Group started circling upon receipt of Buckeye message, 1247 hours, and did two 360 degree turns to right; received second message from Buckeye, 1320, stating weather not breaking as expected but suggesting run on primary. At briefed I.P., 1329 hours, deputy took over, due to failure of lead PFF and Micro-H equipment; over Wesel 1345, but did not drop. Leader took over again at 1414, seeing primary still cloudcovered, took I.P. at 5138N x 0620E, 1421; target Dulmen, 1432; out as briefed, 5240N x 0437E, 1519 hours; Great Yarmouth, 1609; base 1655.

Lead A/C 652-A gave poor returns for navigation. One beacon gave a weak return, but operator finally received beacon clearly enough to make a good Micro-H run.

Deputy lead A/C 362-L gave satisfactory returns. A/C 443-H and 359-S, lead of High and Low respectively, worked satisfactorily for navigation.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

There was no E/A opposition on this Group. P-51's were numerous up to I.P. A fair number present on first run, and none on the second run or the return. First seen at 1240, practically none after 1335.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

Meager to moderate inaccurate tracking A.A. fire from south of Wesel to Haltern. Meager inaccurate A.A. fire from Munster. Damage: Lead, 1 missing (probably safe); 1 slight; Low, 1 severe, 1 slight; High, None.

4. Bombing

At suggestion of Buckeye Red at 1247, group made several 360's before I.P. waiting for visual to clear. Leader then started to make run on primary visual target, but Deputy took over at I.P. when it became apparent primary was probably 10/10, and lead PFF and Micro-H equipment failed to work properly. Deputy found primary 10/10, had trouble with interphone and could not get properly set up at either secondary or last resort. Lead, fiddling equipment again functioning, took over and led way back to primary for a second run. Found primary still 10/10, and made Micro-H run on secondary, Dulmen, dropping at 1432, low and high dropping on lead. Photos show no ground detail.

5. Nickels

None ordered.

6. Weather

6/10, tops 17,000 feet over channel, increasing to 10/10, tops 25,000 feet at I.P. and target. Light non-persistent contrails above 18,000 feet.

7. A/C In Distress

Our A/C 301-U, pilot Callahan, outstanding, reported about 1450 hours that he was short of gas and was heading for friendly territory. Left formation in vicinity of 5300N x 0630E.

8. A/C Landing Away

6 of our A/C landing away have not yet returned to base, three being in France. One of these, pilot Young, A/C 975-F, reports bombing Lingon as P.O. at 1431.

P-51's gave area support from Dutch coast, 1240 hours to 1335 hours. Few after this.
