SUBJECT: Intelligence Report.

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H)

1. Narrative

27 aircraft of the 306th Group took off at 1200 hours to bomb targets in northwest France. The route was as briefed to the target. After bombs away the lead squadron made a wide right turn and left the enemy coast at the same point at which they entered it. The second and third squadrons followed approximately the same route, coming out at Berck-sur-Mer.

2. Bombing

Bombing results decisive. The target, although difficult to find, was identified 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes away by the lead navigator. All the bombs of the lead squadron were seen after turning off the target to be on the target. Photos show beautiful pattern exactly on briefed MPI. The low squadron, in second position, took a second run, and their bombs fell in the southwest part of the target. The high squadron made a third run, and their bombs are reported to have dropped in the fields to the south of the target. No pictures yet available from second and third squadrons.

3. Enemy Fighters

No enemy air opposition was encountered by this Group.

4. Friendly Fighter Support

This Group had no close fighter support, but friendly fighters were seen in the area at a distance.

5. A.A. Gun Fire

There was no A.A. gun fire directed at this Group, but tracking fire was observed directed at groups flying closer to St. Omer.

6. Observations

Large excavation and construction observed at Le Touquet. There was also a large excavation, about one half the size of our primary target, $\frac{1}{2}$ or $3/4$ miles to the west which helped in identification. Target 94, with which this Group is familiar, was clearly seen, and there was no fresh bombing there by 1505 hours. 5 or 6 pyramids, estimated to be about 75 yards across the base and about 75 to 150' high were seen in the target area. They were colored green or gray, and were about one mile apart.




1. No leaflets were carried.
2. Bombing results decisive. The target, although difficult to find, was identified $2\frac{1}{2}$ minutes away ^{by the lead navigator.} All the bombs of the lead squadron were seen after turning off the target to be on the target. Photos show beautiful pattern exactly on briefed MPI. The low squadron, in second position took a second run, and their bombs fell in the southwest part of the target. The high squadron made a third run and their bombs are reported to have dropped in the fields to the south of the target. No pictures yet available from second and third squadrons.
3. No enemy air opposition was encountered by this group.
4. There was no A.A. gunfire directed at this group, but tracking fire was observed directed at groups flying closer to St. Omer.
5. The weather was clear throughout, although there was a slight haze at the target.
6. Large excavation and construction observed at Le Touquet. There was also a large excavation, about one half the size of our primary target, $\frac{1}{2}$ or $3/4$ miles to the west which helped in identification. Target 94, with which this Group is familiar, was clearly seen, and there was no fresh bombing there by 1505 hours. 5 or 6 pyramids, estimated to be about 75 yards across the base and about 75 to 150 feet high were seen in the target area. They were colored green or gray, ^{and were} about one mile apart.
7. This Group had no close fighter support, but friendly fighters were seen in the area at a distance. No friendly aircraft were seen to be in trouble. The route was as briefed to the target. After bombs away the lead squadron took a wide ^{Right} turn and left the enemy coast at the same point at which they entered it. The second and third squadrons followed approximately the same route, coming out at Berck-sur-Mer.




