SUBJECT: Intelligence Narrative  
Mission: LECHFELD, 18th March, 1944.

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H), APO 634.

1. Narrative

306th Flew Lead Group and Lead and Low Squadrons of Low Group in 40th Composite CBW. Navigation was excellent, slight deviation from briefed course, being made only to avoid A.A. gunfire areas or wash of CBWs ahead. Take-off at 0955. Following rendezvous, 40th Composite CBW left Beachy Head at 1135, French coast at 4958N-0111E at 1149 hours. Flew below briefed altitude over continent due to haze, but was able to climb to 22,000' to bomb as weather cleared in target area. (This was still 1500' below briefed bombing altitude.) Bombs away at 1405g, French coast back at 5000N-0115E at 1650 hours, landing at 1804.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

306th had no attacks by enemy aircraft. Fighter escort was excellent except for two short gaps. P-47s in great strength, and P-38s and P-51s chased away the handful of enemy aircraft observed. One Me 410 seen with four P-51s on its tail. The gaps in support were from 1327 to 1352 (I.P.), and from 1430 (approx. 4905N-0945E) to 1505 (approx. 4820N-0720E).

3. A.A. Gun Fire

At target, slight but accurate tracking A.A. gun fire after bombs away, damaged chiefly low Group's planes. Barrages were seen at Augsburg, Munich and from north end of Lake Constance.

4. Bombing

Bombing was very good. Pre-strike photos show black spots on snow as if from previous bombing, spots that make picking out A/C difficult. Strike photos show two lines of bombs on Lechfeld Airdrome, one cutting across buildings and lower section of field and the other the mid-section of the field and runway. A third Group fell short. Bombing was done from 1500 feet lower than briefed when it became apparent that haze overcast would prevent formation seeing target from briefed altitude. Crews reported, and photos confirm presence of over 100 A/C on Landsberg Airfield.

5. Leaflets

50 parcels of U.S. G-19 leaflets were dropped over primary.

6. Weather

A heavy haze over Continent, which thickened at altitude, forced formation to fly and bomb below briefed altitude. However, opening over target area permitted good visibility at bombing. Clouds seen to close over target from North 20 minutes after bombing. Dense con trails also at altitude, and scattered low cumulus.

7. Observations

Fairly heavy smoke, as from a factory, rising from clearing in woods. Time 1250 hours, three minutes after position of 4850N-0500E. Heading approximately 100 degs. on course. About 50 A/C, mostly twins, observed on A/D at Kaufbeuren.

8. Aircraft in Distress

Our A/C #942, pilot Mack, picked up message from B-17 - "Foxhole White" - stating that he had two engines out and was heading for Switzerland. Our A/C also heard "Foxhole White's" message acknowledged by another A/C.

B-24, at 1508 hours at 4820N-0652E, observed proceeding south-east.

5. 50 Parcels of U.S.G-19 Leaflets were dropped over Primary.

4. Bombing was very good. Pre-strike photos show black spots on snow as if from previous bombing, spots that make picking out A/C difficult. Strike photos show two lines of bombs on Lechfeld A/D, one cutting across buildings and lower section of Field and the other the mid section of field and ~~KIMEX~~ runway. A third group fell short. Bombing was done from 1500 feet lower than Briefed when it became apparent that haze overcast would prevent formation seeing target from briefed altitude. Crews reported, and photos confirm presence of over 100 A/C on Landsberg Airfield.

2. 30th flew lead group and lead and low squadrons of low group in 40th composite CBW. No attacks on this group. Fighter escort was excellent except for two short gaps. P-47s in great strength and P-38s and P-51s chased away the handful of E/A observed. 1 Me410 seen with 4 P-51s on its tail. The apparent gaps were from 1327 to 1352 (IP), and from 1430 (approx. 4905N-0945E) to 1505 (approx. 4820N-0720E).

3. At target, slight but accurate tracking flak after bombs away, damaged chiefly low group's planes. Barrages were seen at Augsburg, Munich and from North end of Lake Constance.

6. A heavy haze over Continent, which thickened at altitude, forced formation to fly and bomb below briefed altitude. However, opening over target area permitted good visibility at bombing. Clouds seen to close over target from North ~~20~~ 20 minutes after bombing. Dense con trails also at altitude, and scattered low cumulus.

7. Fairly ~~thick~~ heavy smoke, as from a factory, rising from clearing in woods. Time 1250 hours, three minutes after position of 4850N-0500E. Heading approx 100° on course. About 50 A/C, mostly twins, observed on A/D at Kaufbeuren. ~~See section #2 in re Landsberg A/D.~~

1. Course: 306 flew lead Group and lead and low squadrons of low group in 40th composite CBW. Navigation was excellent, slight deviation from briefed course, being made only to avoid flak areas or wash of CBWs ahead. Take-off at 0955. Following rendezvous, 40th composite CBW left beachy head at 1135, French coast at 4958N-0111E at 1149 hours. Flew below briefed altitude over continent due to haze, but was able to climb to 22,000 to bomb as weather cleared in target area. (This was still 1500 feet below briefed bombing altitude). Bombs away 1405 1/2, French coast back at 5000N-~~11~~ 0115E at 1650 hours, landing at 1804.

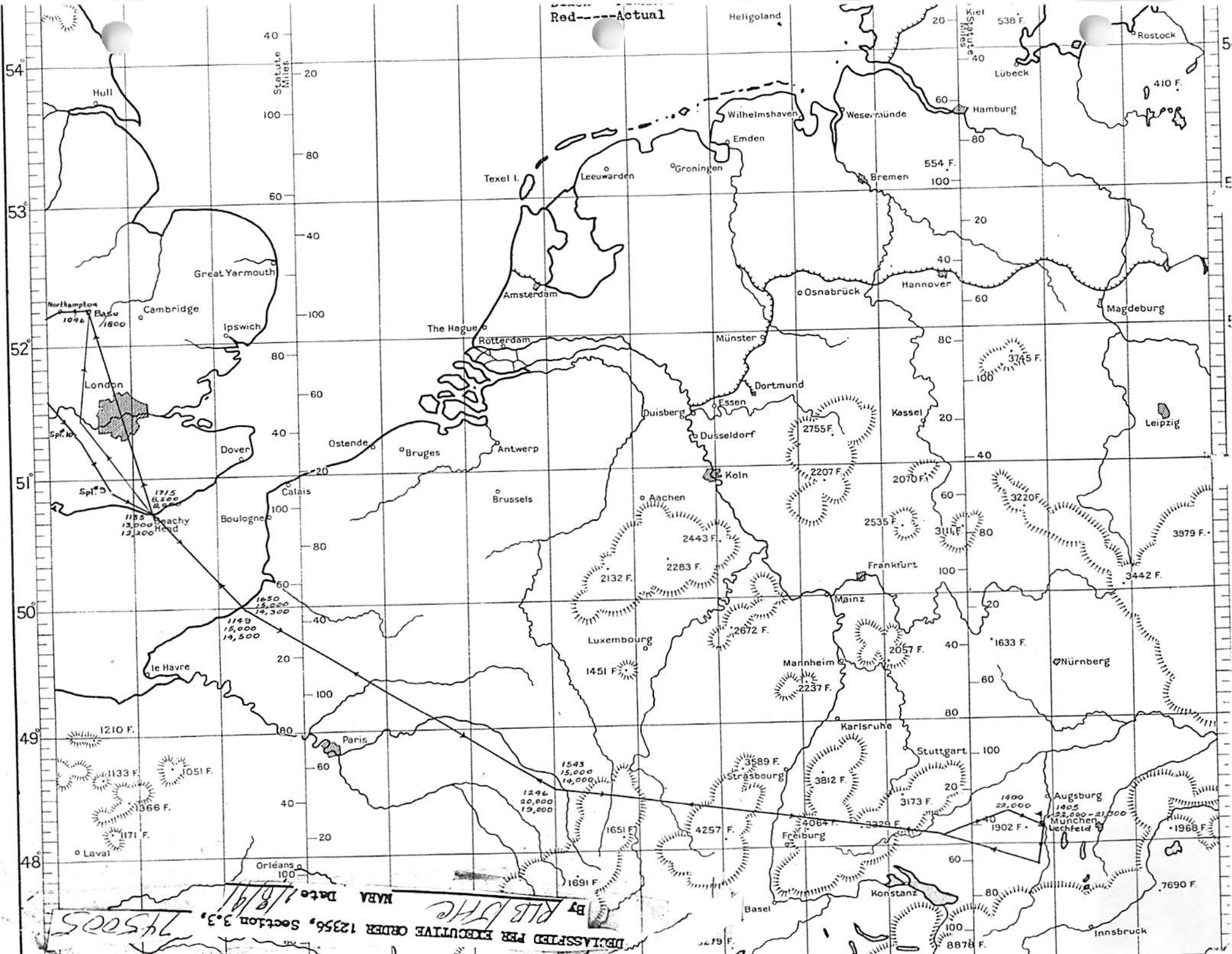

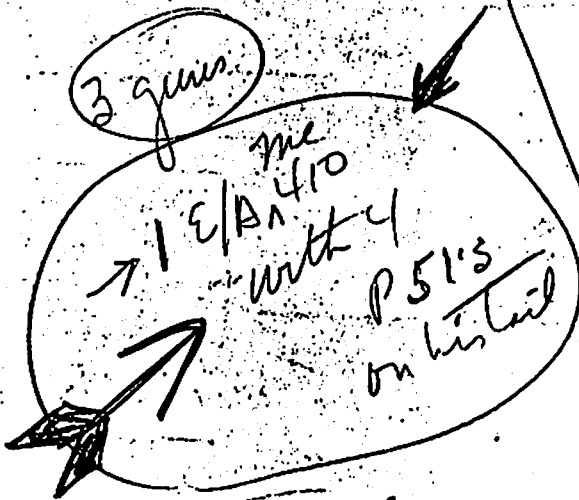

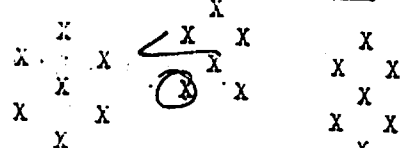
