SUBJECT: Intelligence Report

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H)

1. Hot News

Our A/C 706, Pilot Ryther, is still outstanding. He left the formation over the North Sea after reporting to the group leader by radio that he had a wounded Bombardier and was leaving formation to make land fall as quickly as possible.

One B-17 with group marking "L" in triangle was seen by most of our crews to ditch at 1321 hours at $53^{\circ} 28'N$ - $03^{\circ} 28'E$. It was immediately reported by radio by our lead A/C and one B-17 and two Spitfires were seen to circle it. B-17 stayed afloat 4 minutes. Crew already rescued.

B-17's Seen In Distress

1142 hours One B-17 peeled off to left between I.P. and target. No apparent trouble. No chutes.

1148 B-17 from lead group attacked by five K/A. Two engines on fire. Four chutes seen.

1155 B-17 from group behind attacked by enemy fighters. First smoking then on fire. Four chutes seen.

1201 B-17 flying low attacked by fighters. At 1205 3 chutes from this A/C. Last seen on fire between Aurich and Norden.

1217 B-17 wing came off. Spun to ground. No chutes seen.

1222 B-17 seen circling Vlieland at low altitude as tho trying to make landing under control.

Convoy Sighted

One crew reported convoy of approximately 30 large merchant type ships apparently at anchor at $53^{\circ} 40'N$. - $06^{\circ} 25'E$. at 1218 hours. Reported by phone.

2. Narrative

21 A/C took off 0837. 18 A/C of 306th Group made rendezvous as briefed with 40th Combat Wing which then fell in behind lead Combat Wing. Forced to zigzag to allow lead combat wing to keep lead position while climbing over overcast. Left English Coast 8 minutes late south of course. Crossed Tessel at southern tip of island. Returned to briefed course at enemy mainland at about $53^{\circ} 06'N$. - $05^{\circ} 22'E$ and remained approximately on course for balance of mission.

Pilot Opdyke, was over target but brought back 42 x M47A1 because he could not see group drop bombs. One A/C, # 756, Pilot Campart, released late because of malfunction of release mechanism.

Abortions: One A/C # 776, Pilot Guy, turned back at 1109 hours at $52^{\circ} 57'N$. - $04^{\circ} 37'E$. because his # 1 engine was out and oil pressure dropped. He brought back 42 x M47Al. One A/C # 742, Pilot Lund, turned back at 0915 hours near Bicester because of dropping oil pressure and increasing temperature in one engine. Brought back 42 x M47Al. One A/C # 451, Pilot Gerald, turned back at 1040 hours at English Coast at $52^{\circ} 48'N$. - $01^{\circ} 32'E$. because of sheared drive shaft. Brought back 42 x M47Al. One A/C # 939, Pilot Casseday, turned back at 1042 hours at $52^{\circ} 54'N$. - $01^{\circ} 47'E$. because the superchargers on two engines ran away. Brought back 42 x M47Al.

3. Fighter Opposition

The 306th was high Group of the 40th Combat Wing. Enemy fighter opposition was surprisingly weak. Some 25 single engined and twin engined fighters were seen. A lone ME 109 with silver fuselage, yellow nose, yellow wing tips, and a broad red band on tail made a barrel-roll attack from head on at 1213 hours, coming right through formation for only attack on this group. 6 T/E fighters, ME 110's and ME 210's were seen below at 1157 hours. They flubbed about for twenty minutes attempting without success to climb to the altitude of this group (28,000 ft.). Last seen at 1217 hours. Other S/E E/A confined attacks to stragglers.

4. Fighter Support

Fighter support was excellent. Two groups of P-47's were met at the coast on the way in and furnished close support to the I.P. Two other groups of P-47's were met at the target and stayed with the formation to the coast on the way out. We make no claims.

5. A.A. Gun Fire

Weager, inaccurate A.A. gun fire from Den Helder, Tessel, $52^{\circ} 57'N$ - $08^{\circ} 00'E$, Emden, Borkum and Juist. A.A. gun fire at Bremen was very intense, both barrage and tracking. This group missed most of the barrage which was off to the right apparently aimed at lead Combat Wing from the southern part of the town. Tracking fire was only fairly accurate. Several especially large brown bursts were observed at the target. Volume at Bremen today when firing at seen target reported much greater than last time when enemy batteries were firing at unseen target.

At Bremen 6 or 7 red balls with a slight smoke haze trailing seen to be falling on the down swing of an arc leading to the belief that they came from the ground. When approximately at our altitude, but away from formation, they exploded with a large burst throwing out particles that gradually burned themselves out.

6. Bombing

Two to three-tenths cloud over target. Bombing results partly obscured by haze and smoke screen but results are believed good and strong fires were burning in town area. Unfortunately all 306th cameras failed or aborted. Receiving late instructions, after I.P., to bomb visually, our lead Bombardier set heading based on estimated position of hidden MPI and corrected heading to left fifteen seconds before bombs away when bridges upstream from R.R. bridge were identified. Bombs are believed to have been placed close to, possibly south of, briefed aiming point.

7. Observations

Smoke screen at target rather thin due possibly to late start or strong ground wind. Other smoke screens observed at Wilhelmshaven, Emden, and Oldenburg. Very heavy condensation trails. One bomb from another group seen to drop just inside Dutch Coast.


