Mission: South East of Metz, 23 May, 1944

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H), APO 557

1. Narrative

12 A/C of 306th flew low Group and 9 A/C of 306th in High Group, Composite, 40th "A" Combat Wing, which led 1st Division. Beachy Head, 0730; enemy coast 5000N-0116E, 0748; then over 10.10 cloud cover by DR, believed on course, until clouds stretching in line running roughly East-West, abruptly ceased about 4835 degrees N. Wing swung south on course over clear area, then cut North again at about 4750N-0615E, short of briefed turning point. Positively identified Epinal before flying into overcast area again. Thence to points estimated by DR as 10 miles south of Nancy, to I.P. at 4850N-0640E to bomb at 310 degrees at estimated 4900N-0615E, 0933 hours. Then to point approximately 8 miles northwest of Epernay; then north, leaving St. Quentin and Lille to the left; enemy coast 5105N-0232E, 1052 hours; Clacton 1112 hours; base 1155.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

No enemy aircraft seen. Support was generally good. P-47s were met just inside the French coast on way in and gave good, close support until P-51s were met. Area support by P-51s from I.P. to target. On withdrawal, no P-38s were seen, but a few, scattered P-51s were always in sight until crossing Belgium coast.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

Only 4 burst of A.A. Gun Fire on entire route -- at approximately 4905N - 0520E. -- damaged 1 A/C.

4. Bombing

Bombing was PFF on Wing Leader, over 10/10 cloud, at position estimated 4900N - 0615E, south east of Metz. Results unobserved.

5. Leaflets

No leaflets carried for French target.

6. Weather

8/10 to 10/10 overcast at about 10,000 feet covered Northern France and area of Primary. South of about 4840N clouds broke and visual bombing considered possible in that area.

7. Airborne A/C Returning Early

A/C 036-P, pilot Kabe; A/C 180-K, pilot Baldwin; A/C 042-P, pilot Magner, all spares, turned back as briefed at 5015N-0040E and each brought back 6 x 1000 H.E.

8. Our A/C in Distress

Our A/C 588-D, pilot Troup, was seen to leave formation at 0830 hours with #2 engine smoking and prop windmilling. No radio contact was made. Position 4902N - 0428E, 21,000 feet. This A/C later crash landed on South Coast. 5 killed, 4 injured.

9. AFCE

AFCE worked well for both lead pilots.



1. No leaflets carried for French Target.
2. Bombing was PFF on Wing Leader, over 10/10 cloud, at position estimated 4900N-0615E, South East of Metz. Results unobserved.
3. No enemy aircraft seen. Support was generally good. P-47s were met just inside the French coast on way in and gave good, close support until P-51s were met. Area support by P-51s from I.P. to target. On withdrawal, no P-38s were seen, but a few, scattered P-51s were always in sight until crossing Belgium coast. Out A/C 840 Y, pilot Allen, who turned back at 4738N-0518E was escorted out by 4 P-51s and 2 P-47s.
4. Only 4 bursts of flak on entire route -- at approximately 4905N-0520E -- damaged 1 A/C.
5. 8/10 to 10/10 overcast at about 10,000 feet covered Northern France and area of Primary. South of about 4840N clouds broke and visual bombing considered possible in that area.

IMMEDIATE INTERPRETATION REPORT NO. 107, 2400 hours, 23 May, 1944.

This report covers strike attack photography of the 91st, 92nd, 303rd, 305th, 306th, 351st, 379th, 381st, 384th, 398th, 401st and 457th Bombardment Groups taken during the mission of 23 May, 1944, to targets in FRANCE.

EPINAL

The target was the RAILWAY STATION AND LOCOMOTIVE DEPOT at EPINAL, situated 38 miles S.S.W. of NANCY. It is bounded on all sides by a heavily built-up area, residential on the west and industrial on the north and east. The target occupies a focal position on the most easterly connecting line west of the VOSGES between the PARIS-NANCY-STRASBOURG and the PARIS-CHAUMONT-BELFORT lines.

A concentration of high explosive bombs fell into the north central portion of the target area in the vicinity of the locomotive sheds and repair shops and also into the residential area west of the locomotive sheds.

At least one direct hit can be seen on the locomotive shed and two direct hits were made on the repair shops. These installations can be seen burning late in the attack.

In the northwestern residential section, fires have been started and some damage will result.

A second concentration of high explosive bombs fell into the southern portion of the target area in the vicinity of the passenger station.

At least one hit can be seen on the passenger station. This installation should be also damaged by several near misses. Smoke and debris covers the target area late in the attack making it impossible to assess all strikes.

Some high explosive bombs can be seen bursting in the residential area between the passenger station and the MOSELLE RIVER with fires resulting.

A near miss can be seen to the goods depot east of the locomotive sheds and it will in all probability be damaged from blast.

At least ten hits were made on railway lines in the vicinity of the target area.

Five bombs can be seen bursting in a residential suburb 3000' northwest of the locomotive sheds. Damage will be nil.

A concentration of incendiary bombs can be seen starting to burst at the southern end of the target area and extending north into the smoke in the vicinity of the passenger station. Some damage may be expected from these bombs.

MISCELLANEOUS

A large concentration of high explosive bombs can be seen bursting in the northeastern section of MERLENBACH which is situated 10 miles southwest of SAARERUCKEN. Damage will be slight since most of these bombs fell into open fields and into a lightly built-up area.

Bombs can be seen falling toward BAYON which is located approximately 15 miles S.S.E. of NANCY. These bombs will probably fall into open fields east of BAYON.

Bombs can be seen falling into 10/10's cloud on the missions to SAARERUCKEN, METZ and BLAINVILLE-SUR-L'EAU.

Luftwaffe's Nests Hit by U.S. Fleets

Heavies, Fighters Sweep Europe Looking for a Scrap, but Nazis Refuse

Three thousand American and Allied warplanes stretched an aerial dragnet across the skies of western Europe yesterday, hunting down the German air strength Hitler is saving for invasion day.

From the edges of the Biscay provinces eastward to the Reich itself more than 1,000 American fighter craft—greatest fighter force ever sent up on a single mission—escorted some 600 Fortress and Liberators to six of the Nazis' key air bases, to two rail yards around which central European transport hinges, and to other unspecified targets within western Germany.

The big air fleet, which pounded out from British bases at dawn's first light, split into task forces across western Europe as it carried into its fourth day the newest phase of the pre-invasion offensive aimed at destroying the Luftwaffe and neutralizing the German capacity to shift men and material to meet the Allied D-Day.

1,000 Bomber RAF Raids

Nazi sirens had barely quieted after a night in which the RAF, working on the same plan of widespread attack, had sent ~~more than~~ 1,000 heavy bombers to six targets in Germany and the occupied countries. But where the RAF had flown into bitter combats with night fighters, the big fleet of U.S. daylight heavies and their escorts found almost no resistance, and bomber crews and fighter pilots alike came home with stories of Luftwaffe interceptors which refused to give battle and left their bases to be destroyed without interference.

While the heavies were bombing, and some of the fighters were dropping to hedge-tops to strafe transport and communications targets, the RAF sent out light daylight forces in sweeps over the Low Countries and France, and Channel coast observers described late afternoon formations also heading toward the Continent.

And early yesterday evening German radio announced that "several enemy planes are over western Germany."

A small force of Ninth Air Force Marauders, escorted by Thunderbolts, joined in the day's assaults by attacking military objectives in northern France without loss.

As the daylight forces sought in vain to lure the Luftwaffe to combat, the Forts and Libs made virtually unopposed runs over the railway junctions of Epinal and Chaumont, in southeastern France near the Swiss border, and over six of the main German airfields just behind the first-line coastal defenses: Caen, Avord, Orleans-Bricy, Bourges, Chateau d'Un and Etampes-Mondesir, all within a 120-mile arc south and southwest of Paris.

More than 1,000 Eighth and Ninth Air Force Thunderbolts, Lightnings and long-range Mustangs flew with the bombers, and when it became obvious the Luftwaffe would not fight went down to earth and strafed locomotives, military trains, airfield hangars and gun emplacements.

Only one bomber group reported interception attempts, and these were beaten off by the escorts, who reported that everywhere the German fighters fled from battle. One bomber and three fighters were reported missing out of the big force, as compared with Monday's losses at Kiel and over France of five bombers and eight fighters.

Weather was mixed over the Continent, with cloud layers over some targets forcing the bombers to seek out alternative objectives, and these may have contributed to keeping the Luftwaffe on the ground, but it seemed likely that the reason for the lack of defense was in the husbanding policy which for weeks had limited large-scale interceptions to those occasions when weather favored defense and the target was of prime importance to the Nazis.

The RAF's night attacks, which picked up where Marauders had left off Monday evening with their second sortie of the day, centered on Dortmund and Brunswick, in Germany, and Orleans and Le Mans, in France. Mosquitos went to Ludwigshaven and an airfield in Belgium, and the pre-invasion minelaying aimed at restricting German coastal defenses continued—all for the loss of 35 aircraft, the Air Ministry reported.

While the Allied command was continuing the aerial prelude to invasion the Luftwaffe made another series of reconnaissances in force Monday night against British coastal districts, putting units of swift spy planes over southern England, East Anglia and even the eastern coast of Scotland. Authorities reported casualties and damage at localities in southern England, but none in Scotland, and claimed at least four enemy planes destroyed. The German radio version of the night attacks claimed a blow "in considerable strength" at Portsmouth, and said large fires had been started.
