SUBJECT: Intelligence Narrative.
Mission: BRUNNEN, 24th June, 1944.

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H), APO 557.

1. Narrative

306th flew Lead and Low group of 40th "B" CBW. Rendezvous and assembly were good. Between the two control points over North Sea, "A" Wing ahead flew some 30 miles north of briefed course, apparently to kill time before fighter rendezvous. "A" Wing then cut south before reaching 2nd North Sea control point and drew some A.A. gun fire over Pruisians on way in. "B" Wing continued to control point, and flew to target on course, and to left of "A" Wing ahead. Turn off target by "B" Wing was made as briefed, while "A" Wing flew further south. Thence home approximately on course. 306th also flew High group, high squadron of 40th "A" CBW.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

No enemy air opposition was encountered, but P-38s are reported to have attacked four single S/W fighters near a Wing to the left. Crews report that friendly fighter support was thick. P-38s picked up our planes before the enemy coast shortly before 1230 hours, and were in sight in numbers during the rest of the time over enemy territory. P-47s appeared at 1235, remaining till the target, with P-51s after target at 1311. Six fighters were seen to dive down and circle fresh bursts of A.A. gun fire as if to throw off A.A. guns.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

Moderate and inaccurate at target - mainly low barrage with some tracking. A.A. gun fire also observed at Brunnenhaven, Weseraende, and Neuwark Island. Total damage, 4 major, 3 slight, all low group 40th "B". No damage to lead "B" or 306th a/c with "A" CBW.

4. Bombing

40th "B" bombing was on primary by PFF. Operator reports good run and believes target was hit. Pictures practically 10/10ths cloud but hole in clouds shows smoke bombs very close to primary. Position of 40th "A" bombs not known.

5. Leaflets

No leaflets available.

6. Weather

About as briefed except practically 10/10ths at target.

7. Aircraft in Distress

No aircraft observed in distress.

8. Aircraft Returning Early

A/c 619-G, pilot Oberhelman, and a/c 729-B, pilot Barrett, both spares for "B" CBW, turned back at 5326N-0316E at 1130 hours. Each brought back 12 x 500.

A/c 575-X, pilot Duck, a spare for "A" CBW, turned back at 5326N-0313E at 1127 hours and brought back 12 x 500.

PERIOD UNDER REVIEW.

This report covers all damage to the target between 1530B hours on 19 JUN 1944 and 0800B hours on 28 JUN 1944 and includes the attack by aircraft of U.S. 8th AIR FORCE on 24 JUN 1944. The Immediate Interpretation Report No. K.2584 was issued 29 JUN 1944.

GENERAL STATEMENT.

Twelve out of the fourteen main buildings of Weser Flugzeugbau G.m.b.H. Airframe Factory, reported to be producing Junkers machines, have been damaged, four very severely.

The storage sheds of Potash Export Plant of Deutsches Kalisyndicat were a third destroyed. Three buildings in the Deschimag Shipyards were damaged, one severely. There is slight damage to Norddeutsche Hütte A.G. Steelworks and Coke Oven Plant. Several small industries in the vicinity have been slightly damaged and one practically destroyed. One small cargo vessel and a barge have been partly sunk. There are some 450 craters concentrated in open fields South of the River Weser. No damage is visible to the oil refinery and storage tanks of Deutsche Vacuum Ol. A.G.

DETAILS OF DAMAGE.

Practically all points of damage, with the exception of about 45 incidents of business/residential damage, are shown on the annotated print accompanying this report. Numbers refer to the annotations on Print 4095 attached. This print makes a stereo pair with print 4094 which accompanied the Immediate Report.
