SUBJECT: Intelligence Narrative
Mission: Herseberg, 28 July, 1944

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th bombardment Group (H)

1. Narrative

34 A/C of the 306th, plus 2 PFF, flew as 40th "A" CBW. Assembly was satisfactory and route was flown as briefed: Oxfordness, 0735; 5148N x 0352E at 0805; briefed I.P. at 0938; target 0950; enemy coast 5148N x 0352E at 1217; Oxfordness at 1308; Base at 1345. PFF CBW leader turned lead over to deputy just before I.P. when his PFF equipment was performing unsatisfactorily. He resumed lead immediately after turn off target.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

Friendly fighter escort was excellent all the way. P-51s appeared at enemy coast at 0805; also at 0834 and 0946 and remained till after target. P-38s at 1034 remained over target and all the way out. P-47s just before enemy coast. P-51s provided superb support in pairs for straggling B-17s, being observed with different B-17s at 0810, 0844 and 1126 and also with our A/C 836-P, from Germany to the enemy coast.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

Our CBW encountered a low inaccurate barrage firing into chaff on bomb run followed by meager accurate tracking on turn off target. Some meager, accurate tracking from about six guns at Zietz. Damage was 2 severe, 9 slight, all in lead and high groups - no damage in low group.

4. Bombing

Primary was bombed at 0950 by PFF; results were unobserved due to 10/10ths cloud cover, confirmed by photographs. PFF deputy took over before I.P. when leader's PFF equipment failed. Operators report good run and crews say our smoke bombs were dropped in same place as previous concentration of smoke bombs.

5. Nickels

A/C # 558-W, pilot Smith, dropped two G-9s, two XG-15s and two XG-16s on Primary.

6. Weather

8 to 10/10ths cloud cover over Continent on way in, tops 12,000 ft. 10/10ths at target, 8 to 10/10ths on way out. There were no contrails.

7. A/C in Distress

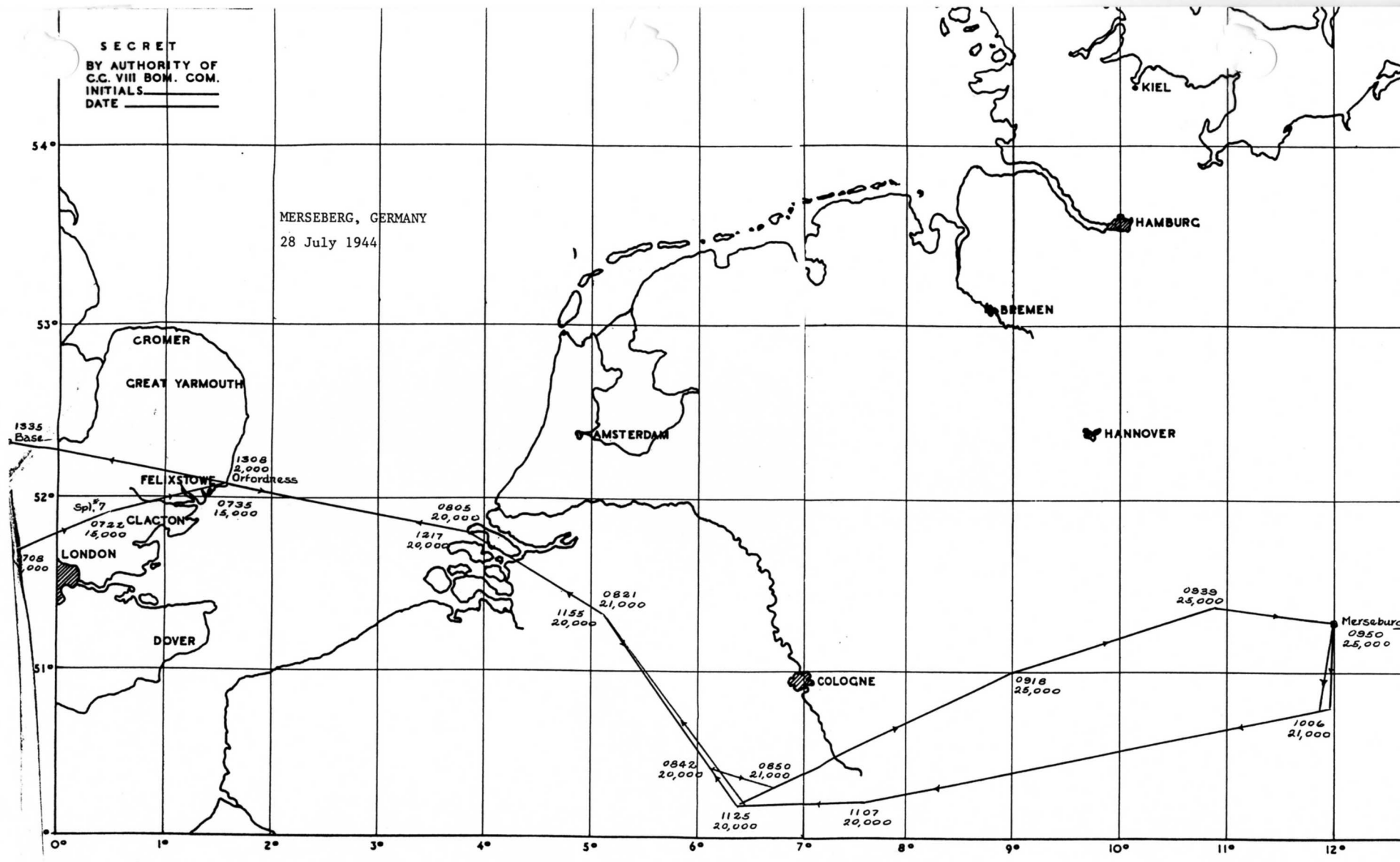
B-17, 1050 hours, near Friedberg, peeled out of formation, went down through the clouds. 7 chutes were seen.

8. A/C Returning Early

A/C #365-Z turned back at 0642 hours, 5119N-0124E, due to runaway prop on #3 engine; brought back 10 x 500 H.E.
A/C #086- turned back at 0700 hours, 5122N - 0041E, brought back 10 x 500 H.E.

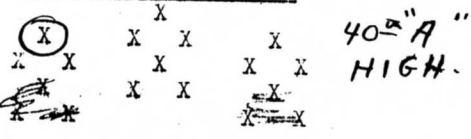

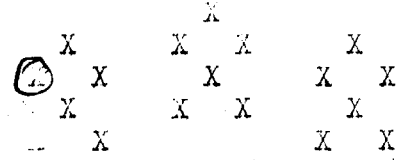
