- 1700 Flarepack laid NE-SW - 4/24
- 1745 Crash tender & ambulance released.  
On Duty - Lt. Peterman
- 1800 Pundit crew reports everything satisfactory.
- 1812 Swinwood informs us their prospects of flashing before 4 or 6 months have passed are remote. Cranfield Pundit and (L/S) - and at present Swinwood does not have Pundit site or personnel for operation of said Pundit. Flying Officer 1st Dir. notified of above, called Malloworth and learned that their Pundit is now S- and also, that they are flashing tonight. Arrangements made for Malloworth to flash on all even days of the month, and their. to flash on all odd days of the month w.e.f. Jan. 2, 1944. <sup>T.F.N.</sup> Malloworth said they will continue flashing tonight - and our Pundit crew to be recalled. 1st Dir. called & notified of "flashing" schedule - and also that we were recalling our Pundit crew. Said this would be permissible as long as 213 continues flashing. 1st Dir. He advised us to send signal to AS4 of above scheduled signal sent to AS4 regarding above new schedule.
