Funeral services for Lt. Bernard F. Weinstein, who was killed in action over Germany, Sept. 13, 1944, while on his 17th mission, will be held at 2 p. m., tomorrow, in the Blank & Talenfeld Funeral Home, 374 South Negley Ave.

Lt. Weinstein End, was a graduate of Schenley High School. Before entering the service he was in the wholesale produce business for his father, Louis Weinstein, on Pike Street.

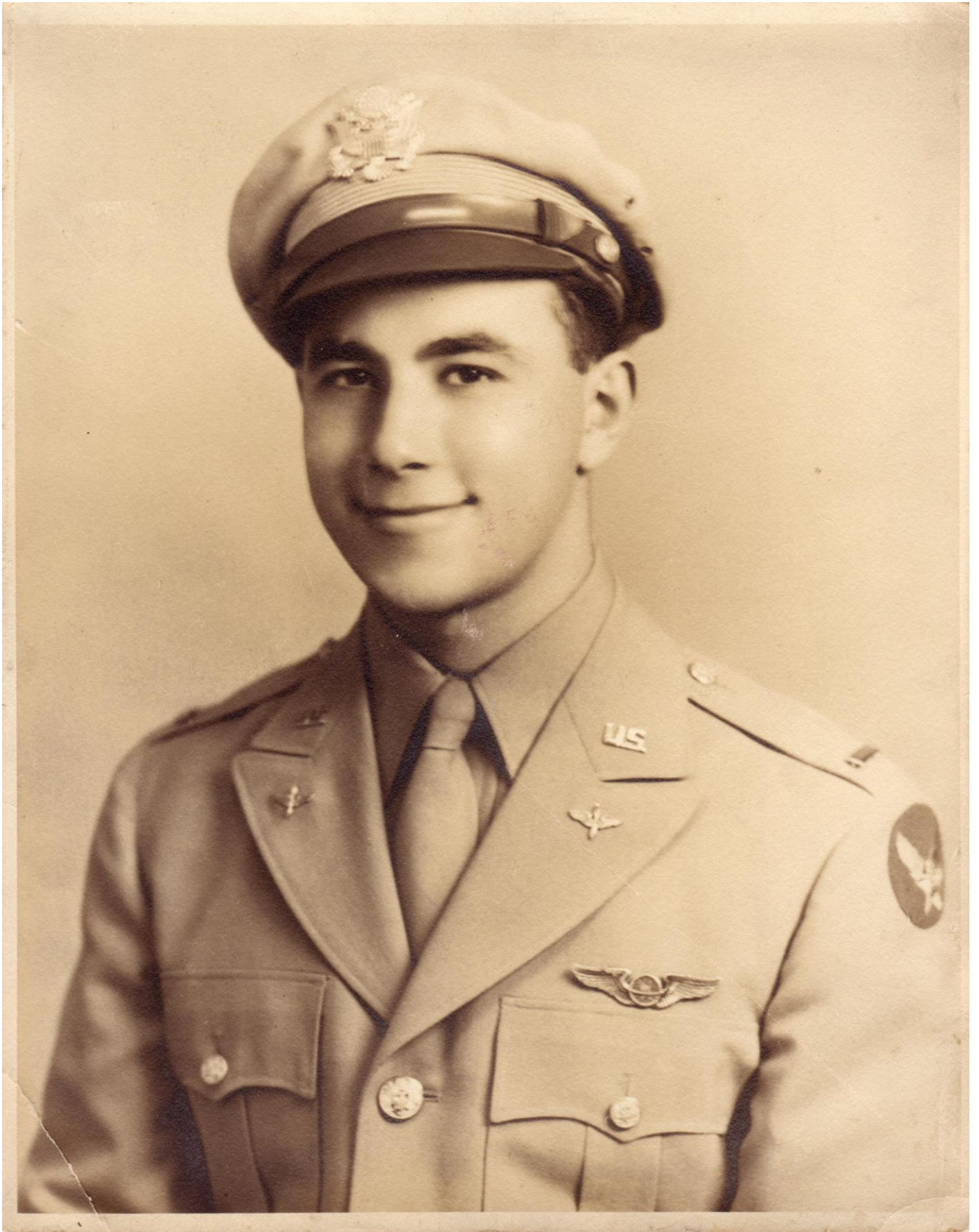
A member of the Eighth Air Force in England, Lt. Weinstein was a navigator and was graduated from the Navigator School of Texas. He entered the service March 3, 1943.

Lt. Weinstein was a member of the Concord Club of the Y. M. & W. H. A.

Surviving are his parents, Louis and Mrs. Katie Weinstein; a brother, Jack, and a sister, Mrs. Jack Schwartz.

Lt. Weinstein had voluntarily entered the service from Civil Life at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, on 7 Sept 1942 as a Private in the US Army Air Corps. He was then a married resident of Allegheny County, PA. His June 30, 1942, WWII Draft Registration card listed his wife Shirley at their Pittsburgh, PA address; and his employment with his father, Louis Weinstein.

At Lt. Weinstein's online FindAGrave Memorial 167321312, a posting volunteer added the citation for this clipped obituary, noting its publication was in *The Pittsburgh Press* on 28 February 1949.
